
Donald MacLean YOUNG

In his final days he was comforted by his family who were a constant presence by his side. He leaves behind his beloved wife of 51 years Roberta, sister Cathy, (Barry), son Bruce (Cathy), grandson Callum, daughter Kim (John), in addition to a wealth of cherished nephews, nieces and lifelong friends. During his 20 years at OAG he was a steady presence on the senior leadership team and carried responsibility for managing audits for some of the largest federal departments. He was deeply committed to the positive role of government and at his core believed in the integrity of a professional, impartial public service. He served as President of the BC Institute of Chartered Accountants and was named a Fellow of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants in 1992 for his distinguished service to the profession. While he loved his career, it did not define him. Away from the office he was known for his self deprecating, bone-dry sense of humour, love of the bagpipes, eating peanut butter from the jar with a spoon and for being a loyal and loving husband and father. He taught his children that the sky was the limit if only they applied themselves. He enjoyed his days in Vancouver the most, especially taking his boat, the "Big Wig" out for a sail with friends and family. In 2002 he retired to Morgan Creek where his days were filled

with daily golf, further world travels with Roberta and the great joy of watching his southpaw grandson strike out batters.
