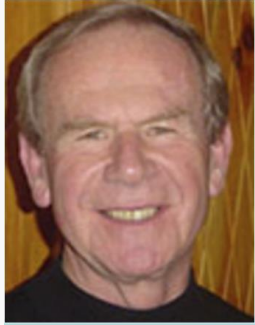


Malcolm Kenneth SMITH
